Careers of the future

Some areas of work may be growing fast though experts believe that perhaps around 60 per cent of the jobs around in 10 years' time have yet to be invented.

- Computer technology including; Software developer, Online merchandiser, Big data analyst, Cyber security expert, data communications analysts, VFX / CGI
- **Engineer** including Mechanical, electronics, controls engineering and computers into the product design process, Smart meter fitter, Diagnostics technician (light electric vehicle)
- **Healthcare sector -** include nurses, physician assistants, physical therapists and dental hygienists, forensic science technician.
- **Biotechnology/Nanotechnology, Food and energy technology**. Epidemiologists (Epidemiologists research the causes and effects of viruses and diseases in an increasingly global society.)
- **Teaching** and **Pre-school teaching** / and **care of the elderly** are all areas where openings are set to increase.
- **Public service professions** including the Fire Service, Ambulance & Paramedics,. Army/Navy/RAF, Commercial Pilots.


A Level results 2017

Why Rooks Heath? Excellent pastoral support

Aim is to provide:

- Academic support (including individualised learning programmes, additional study and revision skills training, attendance and punctuality monitoring, intervention strategies and personalised careers/university advice)

- Head of Sixth


Why Rooks Heath? Individualised support for Most Able students in their UCAS application

- Most Able students are supported with their university applications (either Oxford/Cambridge Universities or Medicine, Veterinary Science or Dentistry) through:
- Attendance on the Lumina course
- Regular meetings with the Most Able coordinator for help with writing the personal statement, choosing the most suitable college/university, preparing for entrance exams and performing well at interview
- Currently we have 3 year 13 students being encouraged and supported with their applications.

Why Rooks Heath?

We will maximise your breadth of subjects whilst minimising the number of exams you take

- In year 12, most students will study 4 A levels opportunity to study a wider curriculum e.g. maths, science, humanity, language, art & design, design & technology, media based subject
- Mocks in November and later assessments if necessary will be used to identify your weakest subject
- At the end of year 12 students sit AS exams for weakest subject only which they do not continue to year 13
- At the end of year 13 students sit A level exams for their 3 remaining subjects

Why Rooks Heath? Popular BTEC courses are available

BTEC Level 3 Nationals

- Extended Diploma (= 3 A levels): Health and Social Care
- Diploma (= 2 A levels): Health and Social Care, Business Studies and Media Studies
- Extended Certificate (= 1 A level): Performing Arts, Applied Science, IT, Media Studies and Sport

What is a BTEC Level 3 National?

- A specialist, vocational-related qualification for students who have a fairly clear view of their future career
- A more practical approach to study inspiring confidence
- Assessment is a mixture of coursework and exams (Ext cert = 58%, Diploma = 46% and Ext Dip = 42%)
- An accepted route to university

Does Rooks Heath want you? What are the entry requirements?

A Levels

- 6 or more GCSEs at grades 9-5; including at least a grade 5 at Maths and English Language, you can choose to follow a programme of 4 A level subjects in year 12
- Studying 5 A levels is possible but an exception
- There are some subject specific requirements e.g. Maths require at least a grade 6 at GCSE. Please refer to minimum entry requirements sheet

BTEC Level 3 Nationals

- If you have 5 or more GCSEs at grades 9-4; including at least a grade 4 at Maths <u>or</u> English Language, you can study a BTEC National Level 3 programme
- Students who have studied a BTEC at level 2 should have achieved at least a Pass.

Students without a grade 4 or better in GCSE English or Maths will be expected to follow a timetabled re-sit programme.

How do I apply to Sixth Form College?

- Prospective Parents Evening Tonight
- Mock exams in many subjects beginning first week after half term
- Predicted GCSE grades 23rd November
- Reports 13th December
- Post 16 interviews 9th- 12th January
- Harrow Collegiate Application form Deadline 26th January.

If your are applying out of Borough or out of the Collegiate then you will need to complete a separate application form
