**AO2** Refine work by exploring ideas, selecting and experimenting with appropriate media, materials, techniques and processes.


**AO3** Record ideas, observations and insights relevant to intentions as work progresses.

#### **Key Terms**

**Research** – A detailed study of a subject/artist/theme, to discover new information.

**Develop** – To take forward or build upon information, investigations and ideas.

**Explore** – To investigate, to examine.

**Refine** – To look at work and make it better.

**Experiment** – To explore different ways and means of doing things.

**Record** – information, experiences and observations make drawings, take photos, add notes documenting where the ideas came from.

**Respond** – To react to information creatively producing artwork in response to the given or chosen theme.

**Abstraction** – To change the way something is shown, to simplify, to evoke a feeling, show emotion and movement.

**Detail** – a close up or small section of a larger art-work

Composition – how art works are organised – foreground, background, use of light, colour, line, shape, form etc.

**Contextual links** – To see how own work connects to that of the artists studied.

**Gridding up/enlarge** – To make bigger using a grid.
