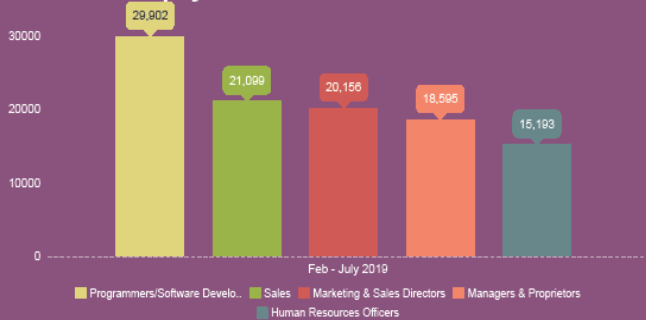

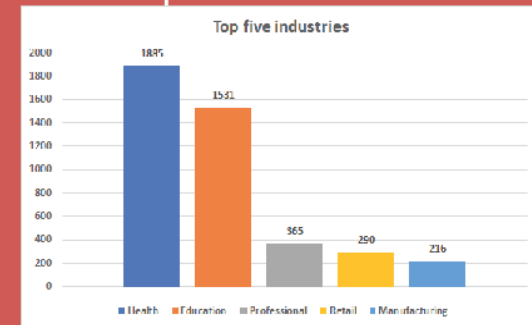

Careers Planning Calendar

Autumn Term: September - December

- Research courses / careers / colleges / sixth forms / apprenticeships
- Attend open days
- Careers interviews / drop in
- Mock Exams – Predicated grades are important!

Spring Terms: January – April

- Complete college / sixth form applications (January-February)
- College / sixth form interviews and conditional offers made (March)
- Complete applications for apprenticeships (April)
- Keep up with course work / revision

GCSE results day - August - Offers confirmed & enrolment

How do I decide what's best for me?

- ▶ Book a 1:1 meeting with your Careers Advisor
- ▶ Speak to your subject teachers – Grades.
- ▶ Compare the variety of subject options at Rooks Heath with other 6th forms.
- ▶ If you are unsure about what you want to do, you could access online career programs that help you to examine your interests and suggests careers or courses that could be appropriate.

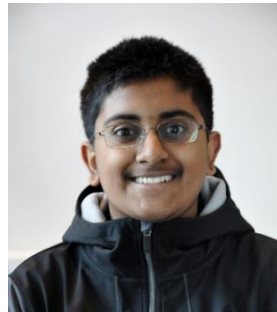

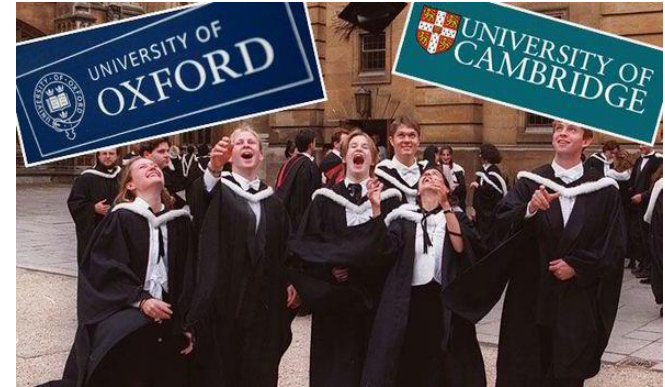

Individualised support for Most Able students in their UCAS application

- Most Able students are supported with their university applications (either Oxford/Cambridge Universities or Medicine, Veterinary Science or Dentistry) through:
- Lumina and St John's College, Oxford Inspire courses
- Regular meetings with the Most Able co-ordinator for help with writing the personal statement, choosing the most suitable college/university, preparing for entrance exams and performing well at interview
- Currently we have 5 year 13 students being encouraged and supported with their applications.

Caring pastoral support

Aim is to provide:

- Academic support (including individualised learning programmes, additional study and revision skills training, attendance and punctuality monitoring, intervention strategies and personalised careers/university advice)
- Behaviour support
- Emotional support

Achieved through:

- **Experienced tutors** in the Sixth Form – typical tutor group size of 18. In year 12, students see their form tutors daily during morning registration and a one hour weekly tutorial session (supported by regular assemblies) which deliver a topical and relevant programme
- **Counselling** service

What is a BTEC Level 3 National?

- A specialist, vocational-related qualification for students who have a fairly clear view of their future career
- A more practical approach to study inspiring confidence
- Assessment is a mixture of coursework and exams (Ext cert = 58%, Diploma = 46% and Ext Dip = 42%)
- An accepted route to university

What are the entry requirements?

A Levels

- 6 or more GCSEs at grades 9-5; **including at least a grade 5 at Maths and English Language**, you can choose to follow a programme of 3/4 A level subjects in year 12
- There are some subject specific requirements e.g. Maths require at least a grade 6 at GCSE. Please refer to minimum entry requirements sheet

BTEC Level 3 Nationals

- If you have 5 or more GCSEs at grades 9-4; **including at least a grade 4 at Maths or English Language**, you can study a BTEC National Level 3 programme
- Students who have studied a BTEC at level 2 should have achieved at least a Pass.

Students without a grade 4 or better in GCSE English or Maths will be expected to follow a timetabled re-sit programme.

How do I apply to Sixth Form College?

- Prospective Parents Evening – Tonight
- Mock exams in many subjects beginning first week after half term
- Predicted GCSE grades – 25th November
- Reports – 13th December
- Post 16 interviews – 13th- 17th January
- Deadline for Harrow Collegiate Application form – 7th Feb
If you are applying out of Borough or out of the Collegiate then you will need to complete a separate application form
- GCSE results day – 20th August 2020
- Sixth form enrolment – Thursday 3rd Sept 2020
