At Rooks Heath School, we believe that promoting a 'Reading for Pleasure' culture is a not just a building block for academic success but also for achieving fulfilling careers and rewarding lives.

Research shows that reading has numerous benefits in many areas including:

- Increasing vocabulary
- Expanding the understanding of grammar
- Developing spelling skills
- Increasing progress in writing attainment
- Developing positive attitudes to reading and writing
- Promoting a knowledge and understanding of the world and other people
- Achievement in cross-curricular subjects, including Maths
- Developing empathy and understanding of emotions
- Development of our sense of 'self' and identity

To encourage all students to engage more actively with regular reading the English department are introducing Reading Logs as a formal weekly homework task.

Students will be expected to read **at least four times** per week, **recording this** in their logs alongside a weekly response to **one guided reading question**. These Reading Logs will be **checked fortnightly** during their Library lessons. On TRACK points will be awarded to students who display these values in their written responses to what they read.

Shared reading is a great way to develop children's language and communication and boost their reading skills. Embedding regular reading routines outside of the classroom can offer numerous opportunities to promote the benefits of reading.
