ARRANGEMENTS FOR THE END OF AUTUMN TERM AND THE START OF THE SPRING TERM 2022

I hope that this email finds you and your families well. As I write to you, we are currently enjoying a little bit of the festive spirit as staff and students are enjoying the Christmas Jumper Mufti day. I am sure you are really looking forward to enjoying the Christmas holiday period. Please note this letter contains a number of important links. It seems we are not out of the woods regarding the pandemic and safety measures.

Students have worked very hard this term and, to inject some fun to the end of term, their Head of Year has planned a festive activity for the final day of this autumn term. Students will end their day on Friday 17th December as follows:

Further to my letter informing you of the need for lateral flow testing, I am writing to confirm arrangements for the student's return to school in January.

The DfE has said that "all secondary pupils 'should' receive **one** on-site lateral flow test prior to their return in January. Schools can stagger the return of students across the first week to manage this. Therefore, the arrangements for the first few days of the spring term 2022 are outlined below. Please note that on Tuesday and Wednesday, 4th & 5th January respectively, students need only attend school for their lateral flow test at their allocated time detailed below. They do not need to wear school uniform to complete their test. All students will return to school for registration as normal on Thursday 6th January.

Mask wearing:

In line with updated government guidance, please remember to ensure that your child comes to school with a face mask to wear when in internal communal areas. This measure is currently applicable to staff, students and visitors until further notice.

Uniform Expectations – a reminder

We have the highest standards of presentation and we feel strongly that **the school uniform must be worn with pride by all our students on the way to school and on the way home from school**. We do not accept students being out of school uniform unless there is an explicit and valid explanation which has been discussed with your child's Head of Year or a Senior Leader.

As always, we would like to support our Rooks Heath families to recycle uniforms where possible and, in particular, to exchange blazers for larger sizes where required. We have a number of pre-owned blazers and other items of uniform in good condition. If your child's blazer has become too small and is still in a good condition, we would be very pleased to arrange an exchange. We are also happy to accept other uniform donations. Please ensure items are cleaned before donating. If you have uniform to donate, please deliver it to the school reception.

We understand that there may be some families experiencing financial hardship. We would also be happy to support by providing a blazer (blue or black) or other items of school clothing where we have stock. We cannot accept any money for any items we give you, however if you would like to give something in return, we would encourage you to support any of the fundraising initiatives we promote. If you are interested in sourcing second-hand uniform from the school, please email the school or ask at Reception and someone will contact you to make the necessary arrangements.

The basic standards to which we expect all students to adhere have not changed. Please take the time to remind yourself of those standards by reading through all of the detail on the uniform page of our website: <u>Uniform Expectations</u>.

In particular, we would like to draw your attention to our expectations regarding jewellery and piercings. Students may wear one small set of studs in their ear lobes. No other form of piercing is permitted and no other jewellery beyond a wristwatch. Students will be asked to remove any additional piercings that are visible. Hair must be of a natural colour. We will not engage in conversations about uniform and piercings or jewellery which may take up valuable time in teaching, learning and building a positive ethos and culture in and around the school. I am confident that all our parents and carers will support the school by adhering to the Home/ School agreement and ensuring that your child follows our regulations so we can focus on the important aspects of learning and development.





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Attendance and punctuality drive

We would like to congratulate every child who has achieved at least 95% or above attendance throughout this term. We know that the need to be alert to the symptoms of Coronavirus have had an impact on the consistent attendance we experienced before the pandemic. Remember, every day of learning counts and

your child's academic success is directly linked to their ability to be in school learning from face-to-face teaching. We want every child to experience the successes we are able to enjoy year on year. We know that being at school every day and on time enhances how well students feel a sense of belonging and part of the school community.
