In the interim, while we look to recruit a suitable replacement, the department is providing relevant material for students to complete. The department is also making adjustments, so that students can receive teacher input, whenever possible.

	Mr. Todd: we are doing many spot-checks of toilets. Mr. Ahmed is involved. We appreciate that it is very unpleasant for children .		
	Mrs Manderson: I check the toilets every day. Vaping is an issue. We are narrowing down and identifying the main culprits. Students should inform Mr Todd if they see vapers. New toilets are on their way.		
	Do students need their own guitar for lessons?		
	Mrs Manderson: Yes		
Mrs Solanki	Son is settling in. Satchel is very helpful. Secondary school is all a learning curve. Would like email addresses for Head of Year and Form Tutor.

	Mrs Manderson: This is unacceptable. Canteen staff must be informed immediately if this happens again, so that the food item can be replaced.

	Mrs Manderson: At the up-coming Strive to be your Best evening we will be providing revision guidance and material for all Year 11 students.		
	The SIMS Parent App does not flag up homework		
	Mrs Manderson: We advise parents to use the Satchel to see homework tasks that have been set. We will chase up the instructions letter for parents about setting this up.		
Mr Sahay	Concerned about there not currently being a maths teacher and the lack of expertise from the stand-ins.		
	Mrs Manderson: The situation was explained earlier in this meeting. We have supply and cover teachers in this interim period. We are looking to get a long-term supply or, ideally, a permanent for January, but only if they are suitable.		
	Mr Sahay said that he will be willing to help.		
	Mrs Manderson: We will do all we can to get this resolved. We understand the concerns.		
	Mr Sahay would like the school's STEM results for the last 5 years.		
	Mrs Manderson: The 2020 and 2021 were not published, as schools did not hold public exams. Otherwise, results are analysed yearly by the school.		
Mrs Fernandes	Chess Club? It was very popular before.		
	Mrs Manderson: The member of staff who ran Chess Club is currently on sick leave. We will look to see if another member of staff can take over the running of it.		
	Is the Most Able programme up and running?		
	Mrs Manderson: Yes, it is. It has been taken over by Mr Wilson. Also, the new Master Classes are being launched across most subject areas.		
	Will Year 10 students receive their target grades?		
	Mrs Manderson: Yes, via their teachers.

	a trip abroad. Mr Sharp, in his role as Cultural Lead, is encouraging staff to organise trips.

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	Mrs Manderson: Mr Turner, a new, but highly experienced, music teacher.

	Mrs Manderson: We have appointed staff who will assist in the dissemination of contactus emails.
