**Re: Planned Strike Action by NEU Teacher Union – Wednesday 5<sup>th</sup> and Friday 7<sup>th</sup> July**

You will be aware from media coverage that the National Education Union (NEU) has declared further strike action. I am writing to confirm with you our arrangements for the two dates above.

The strikes will take place because of a continuing national dispute between the teacher unions and the government over teachers' pay and the impact of funding on schools and not because of any issues at our school.

Presently the NEU are the only union so far to have planned strike dates. Members of the NEU are not required to inform me of their decision to take strike action. However, we are aware that the majority will take action and we are committed to our examination students for this year.

For the two dates above our arrangements will be as follows:

- All students in Year 10 are to attend school as normal in full school uniform for all exams. Where a student has a morning and afternoon exam, they will be able to go home and return for the afternoon. If they are unable to study at home, we will make space available for them to study between the two exams.
- Students in Year 12 will be invited directly by their teachers for any classes being held in school. All other KS5 students may continue independent study at home.
- We are aware that students may have one day of religious observance for Eid on Wednesday 28<sup>th</sup> June. The Year 10 exams for that date have been moved to the second NEU strike day, 7<sup>th</sup> July. For students celebrating on the Thursday 6<sup>th</sup> July, they may come only for their exams and will be able to sign out (with parental permission) Please see the updated timetable for the Year 10 exams here: Please click [here](#) to view the Y10 Mock Timetable.
- We will audit our Year 10 and 12 students so that for any students without a quiet place to study who have let us know, we can arrange adequate provision for them to study in rooms at school.
- Students in Years 7 – 9 should stay at home. Where there are classes with teachers who are not striking, students will need to work from home with set tasks from these teachers, where possible on Satchel One and Teams. If there is no access to IT, we have asked these teachers to ensure students are set work they can do offline by Wednesday 5<sup>th</sup> July and Friday 7<sup>th</sup> July.
- Special arrangements will also be made for students with specific contexts. The safeguarding team will organise this on a case-by-case basis.
- Any students that are on site and in receipt of a free school meal will have access to this.





- For students at home who are also in receipt of a free school meal, we are able to provide lunch on site.
- For those students who would like to take up this offer, you must let us know by clicking here <https://forms.office.com/e/DBKkvYZUwd> **before** 12pm on Monday 3<sup>rd</sup> July. Students will need to be on site at 12:30pm in full school uniform and will be dismissed at 1:10pm.

Please note that this means that for this day, there may not be work set for every subject for every child. There may be periods of the day where students have no work set.

At this point in time, we also plan to continue with our New Intake / Year 6 Transition Day on the Wednesday 5<sup>th</sup> July. I will write to all our incoming Year 7 parents with further details next week.

We are working closely with our staff union representatives to keep up to date with the situation, and I will inform you as soon as possible if arrangements change further.
