Dear Parents / Carers of Year 10 Students,

YEAR 10 MOCK ARRANGEMENTS

Year 10 Mock Examinations will take place next half term, between Thursday 27 June and Tuesday 9 July. These very important assessments will help inform students, their teachers, and you of how well they are doing in each subject. Students will receive a statement of results in the weeks following their exams. There is only one further set of Mocks before students' real GCSEs (in November), and so it is important students are prepared and succeed.

Please [click here](#) to view the Y10 Mock Timetable. The Year 10 Mock Exams will run like a normal public exam season and during the Mock Exams, we will have the following arrangements:

- For morning exams students may go to the Rookery from 8:30am and should be at the gyms ready for their morning exams at 9am.
- For afternoon exams students should make their way to the gyms at the end of lunch at 1:10pm.
- Students must attend all their exams promptly and be ready to start, in full uniform and with all necessary equipment (i.e. a black pen, a clear pencil case and, if appropriate, a calculator without a lid).
- Students must attend their usual lessons when they do not have an exam timetabled. Teachers will be doing one of the following activities:
 - Running revision sessions towards an exam in that subject.
 - Allowing students to revise independently.
 - Continuing with coursework in vocational subjects.
- Students will finish their school day at 2:45pm and will be dismissed off site at that time. If a student's exam is still taking place at 2:45pm, then students will be dismissed after their exam finishes.

We would ask you to continue to encourage them to revise every day until the end of the Year 10 Mocks. Students should aim to revise all of their subjects for their Year 10 Mocks as they will be examined on all of those subjects at the end of Year 11. Religious Studies will not be examined within the Year 10 Mocks, but will be examined in the Year 11 Mocks. In addition to the examinations in the gyms, students who are studying Modern Foreign Languages will have speaking exams as shown on the Mock Exam Timetable.
