Dear Parents/Carers,

RE: Reinstatement of After-School Activities

I am writing to update you further to my letter on Friday 15th May.

After the decision to cancel all after-school activities, we continued to liaise closely with the police and seek further guidance. We were advised that police availability on Monday and Tuesday might be limited and therefore felt it was a sensible precaution to suspend activities on those two days.

During this time, staff remained on duty after school, and students cooperated fully with our request to go straight home. Given their positive response, we feel it would be unfair to continue restricting access to after-school activities, including the important revision sessions for examination students.

The Metropolitan Neighbourhood Police Team have advised that there will be an increased police presence at the end of the school day from today until we break up for the half term on Friday and therefore **all after-school activities will resume as normal**. We understand that parents and carers may choose whether or not their child attends after school activities; however, please note that any detentions issued as sanctions must still be completed. Parents and carers who wish to collect their children from school should arrange a clear meeting point with them in advance.

We recognise that collection may not be feasible for all families. Staff will continue to be visible and on duty at the end of the school day, in line with our usual dismissal routines, to support students in leaving the site safely. Thank you once again for your understanding, cooperation, and continued support during this challenging time.
