NCS is all about helping teenagers realise their potential by giving them a taste of independence and loading them up with new skills that set them up to achieve their future goals, whatever they may be. And this year, it is your teen's turn!

We would normally attend school to give an assembly and allow your teen the chance to express their interest in coming away with us. This year, to keep a safe distance, we will tell your teen about the programme via a video that will be shown at school and we will ask them to sign up online at wearencs.com.

If your teen wants to register their interest in taking part in NCS this summer, we will ask them to share your contact details. This is so that we can complete the administrative process required to get them signed up to a programme date. If they let us know they are interested, we will be in touch with you by email or phone to run through the steps we need to complete their booking.

#### What is NCS?

So far, over 600,000 young people across the country have participated in NCS. Last August, teenagers on NCS donated 200,000 hours of their time to help rebuild their communities after the first lockdown, showing what a difference young people can make when they work together towards a goal.

There is the option of doing a 2-week programme or 3-week programme, in either residential or non-residential settings, depending on restrictions.

3-week programme – week 1 - residential, week 2 – independent living and skills development, week 3 - social action project
2-week programme – week 1 - independent living and skills development and week 2 - social action project

#### Structure of the Programme

\*Due to COVID 19, residential activities are dependent on restrictions\*

Phase 1: 5 day residential (3-week programme only)
Phase 2: Independent living and skills development
Phase 3: Social Action Project
Phase 4: Celebration of participation at an awards evening at Watford
Football Club – subject to restrictions

### Key Dates for 2021

NCS programmes run outside of school term time. We have four waves running in Watford for Summer 2021:

3 week wave - 12/07/2021 - 30/07/2021 2 week wave - 02/08/2021 - 13/08/2021

The NCS experience will cost a maximum of £50 contribution per young person. The government fund the remaining £1,500 to ensure it is an inclusive experience, available to all.
