Dear Parents/Carers and Students of Year 13,

Assessment Arrangements

Year 13 students are now beginning their Summer Assessment Season from Monday 10th to Friday 28th May. Teachers will use these Summer Assessments to inform their overall TAGs, and so it is in students' best interests to revise thoroughly in order to do well.

The arrangements for these assessments are as follows:

- Students who fail to bring their ID badges to school (both for assessments and for their entry to the school site) will be refused entry to their exam. New ID badges can be purchased on ParentPay.
- Students who do not follow the school's dress code will be sent home to change.
- For morning assessments, students should arrive to school by 9:00am and line up outside their designated exam room.
- Following a morning assessment, students should attend any timetabled lessons they have for the remainder of the day.
- For afternoon assessments, students should arrive to school by 1:10pm and line up outside their designated exam room.
- Following an afternoon assessment, students will be dismissed from school.
- Students must attend all their assessments.

Study Leave

There is no study leave for Year 13 students. Students should continue to follow their timetables until Friday 28th May. However, the following concessions do apply:

- Students are allowed to take the session off immediately prior to an assessment. For example, if a student has an afternoon assessment, then they can remain at home for the morning to revise or if they have a morning assessment then they do not need to attend the afternoon lesson of the previous day. However, students cannot take a Friday afternoon off to prepare for an assessment scheduled for a Monday morning. Attendance will still be recorded.
- For A level subjects, the WJEC Applied Diploma in Criminology and GCSE maths and English Language, students should attend their timetabled lessons until they have sat their final assessment for that subject. From that point on, students do not need to attend lessons for that specific subject. For example, if a student has their final Biology assessment on Friday 21st May, then that student should not attend any further Biology lessons after that date.
- For BTEC level 3 subjects, students should attend their timetabled lessons until they have completed all their coursework and assessments for that subject and have been given confirmation from their teacher that all coursework is complete, and they are no longer required to attend lessons.
- Students are no longer required to attend their period 6 tutorials on Tuesday afternoons.





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• Please note, when students have a timetabled lesson for period 1, they are required to attend morning registration with their tutor.

Awarding of Qualifications

As you are aware, this year teachers will be assessing students and students will be awarded with A Levels and vocational qualifications based on Teacher Assessed Grades. Teachers will be using a range of evidence to comprise a holistic grade which is based on the quality of the work produced.

Rooks Heath Staff have a rigorous internal quality assurance process which will involve teachers moderating and standardising within departments to ensure fair judgements. All Year 13 teachers have taken part in training to ensure that Teacher Assessed Grades are fair, including training on unconscious bias. There will be a thorough system of checks by Heads of Department, the Assessment Team and the Senior Leadership Team to ensure grades that students are awarded are based on a range of evidence and that no errors are made. Please note that any attempts to influence a teacher in any way to award a certain grade will be considered malpractice and reported to the examination board. We will take any such attempts very seriously. Please also note that we cannot disclose (to students or parents) the final Teacher Assessed Grades until Results Day which is on Tuesday 10th August, when students will be able to collect their results from school from 9am.
